# **OUR VALUES**

In keeping with our Christian Orthodox values, we value kindness, humility, respect, courage and community.

#### Courage

### THE START OF THE DAY

### Absences due to Illness:

### Planned Absence or Leaving Early:

The school must be informed of planned absences within term time. If your child needs to be collected during the school day, he/she should be collected from, and signed out from the drop off/collection point. Where possible, a child should be collected between lessons rather than leave during a lesson.

# **CULTURAL ENRINCHMENT ACTIVITIES**

The curriculum is complemented by a plethora of cultural enrichment activities developing the personal, social and cultural development of each pupil. School plays, dance and music lessons constitute an important part of the curriculum and provide an essential compliment to the work in the classroom. They are enjoyable and nurturing, affording all children the opportunity to learn about their culture, grow appreciation of Greek heritage and develop close friendships.

# HOMEWORK

Children will have homework (i.e. reading, vocabulary, spellings etc) to learn outside school. All pupils will benefit from doing as much reading as possible and progress is maximised if they are able to practise their vocabulary and spellings frequently.

# CURRICULUM

The main focus of the Leicester Greek School curriculum is to build firm language foundations and encourage a love of learning the Greek language. Pupils are taught to a high standard in all four language skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening which leads to success at GCSE and A level.

The children are taught in mixed ability classes and lessons are differentiated to meet their individual needs to enable good progress across the curriculum. Late starters flourish because of our bespoke curriculum and because the syllabus is spiral, in that all areas of vocabulary are regularly re-visited.

Our school follows a comprehensive Greek Language Curriculum provided by the Cypriot and Greek Ministry of Education and Culture for the children of Diaspora. The curriculum is organised and planned for using a thematic approach. This is communicated with our families via our Curriculum Map on a termly basis. The curriculum is creative, skills based and knowledge supported, making learning motivational and successful.

### Principles for Greek Language Learning

Language is best developed in meaningful contexts across the curriculum. A task-based language curriculum, accelerates language acquisition through real-world practice.

Lessons are multifaceted and rich in the myriad techniques and materials teachers use.

A different topic forms the theme for lessons. This approach encourages engagement, exploration, and discovery in every lesson.

Competent levels of language and literacy in a child's first language (L1) enhance subsequent learning in his second language (L2.
